Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a very successful first half of our Spring Term. Cherry Class have been out bird spotting and have reported their findings to The Big Garden Bird Watch 2025. We have also enjoyed an active 'Healthy Me Week' which included speed skipping, yoga, circuit training, orienteering and coaching sessions from Luton Town FC as well as sampling a superfood! The children engaged really well in collaborating over how to keep their bodies and minds healthy and we will be sending their work out into the community in the form of some published books. Our next immersive curriculum week is 'Reading For Pleasure Week' from 3rd March which will include a theatre production of Jungle Book, a puppet show, reading cafes across the school and a book fayre.

Our Family Support Team led our first 'Wellie Swap' to ensure all children have wellingtons in school and we also have a new 'Golden Wellie' trophy for classes who earn the most Opal tokens. Our community Opal 'Stay and Play' was well attended and we are adding to the resources regularly to ensure the best possible play curriculum for the children. Our new house-point token cylinders are rapidly filling up and our house captaincy team are doing a fantastic job of counting them weekly and pouring them into the cylinders in assembly for us all to see.

The Early Years Cake Sale was a success and raised money for more outdoor equipment to enhance the children's play. The year two children really enjoyed their trip to the fire station and I have given a lot of headteachers awards out for some extremely impressive models of The Great Fire of London!

Next half term we look forward to seeing Year Three start their swimming curriculum, World Book Day, our Year Four PGL residential, a School of Rock assembly, a variety of sports competitions, Reading for Pleasure Week, an immersive French cafe and our annual PSA Easter Colouring Competition. In Cherry Class this half term, we have been practising lots of mark making in our 'Message Centre'. We have been writing secret symbols and hiding them for our friends to find! We also took part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch. As part of this work, we went on a walk around the local area, looking out for birds. We also counted the birds we found in our own garden area.

Next half term, we will explore the traditional tale of The Little Red Hen and learn how to make bread. We will also learn the skills to make our own books. We will explore seasonal changes; including planting some seeds and watching them grow. The Cherry Class Team.

Next half term, we will be looking forward to developing our cooking skills further, when thinking about Spring celebrations, such as Shrove Tuesday and Easter. We will be taking part in more Drawing Club activities and continuing to use the Tales Toolkit to support our storytelling skills. In Maths, we will be continuing to develop our understanding of numbers, as well as our measuring skills. In Phonics, we will continue to learn and apply more digraph sounds and tricky words. We have had a brilliant start to 2025 in **Year 1!** We have enjoyed learning about the 7 continents and the different oceans and we have learnt some catchy songs to help us remember them. We have started 'Fluent in Five' during maths lessons, which allows us to start the lesson with mental arithmetic questions. We have also started sending spellings home on a Friday in preparation for a test the following week. The children have responded to this really well and are becoming familiar with the new routine. Please be aware that all children have a Numbots login in their home-school book. This is the same login details as TT rockstars. This app helps the children to become secure with their number bonds and times tables knowledge.

We all loved healthy me week. The children had the chance to participate in a range of activities that supports their mental and physical health and wellbeing. Year 1 enjoyed planning a recipe for a healthy fruit salad. Thank you for all your support with home learning and reading this half term - the children really benefit from it. If you have any queries or questions please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

Next term, we continue to develop the children's phonic understanding in preparation for their phonics assessment in June. We will also be learning about important people from the past. This will give children the chance to learn about the interesting lives of Emilia Earheart and Amy Johnson! We are also super excited for our trip to Woburn Safari Park!

What have we been up to?



Year 2 have been busy learning about The Great Fire of London, which they have thoroughly enjoyed. We have just finished writing a poem about the GFoL, we used rhyming words, adjectives and verbs. Children have loved learning about the fascinating history of London, and comparing fire safety equipment to what we have today, culminating in a visit to our local fire station. In maths we have been dividing using concrete resources and moving on to more challenging questions using reasoning skills. We have loved learning how to play the Ocarina in music lessons and we already know how to play 3 notes! Last week we had 'Healthy Me Week' which incorporated skipping workshops, yoga, eating new foods and finding out how to stay healthy. The children enjoyed doing dance in PE where they have learnt lots of new dance moves!

Next term, we look forward to preparing for our Spring Showcase, continuing to explore different materials in Science and exploring shape in maths. The Year 2 Team.

Year 3 have been enjoying starting their Egyptian topic this term. We have been focusing on the Geography aspect of this, learning about where in the world Egypt is, the climate of the country and the importance on The River Nile. The children are looking forward to delving deeper into the History of Ancient Egypt next half term and can't wait to learn all about mummification and the role of the Pharoah. We had a fantastic lesson about Judaism from the children in Year 4 and it was great to see the children engaged with each other's teaching and learning.

This half term we have been having fun in dance and gym sessions during PE, and next half term we will be starting our swimming lessons at Flitwick Leisure Centre. Year 3 have been fully immersed in Healthy Me Week and loved challenging themselves during the skipping session. We are so proud of the progress the children have made with their learning, particularly in their times tables and spellings assessments. Well done Year 3, keep up the hard work! The Year 3 team.



Year 4 have really enjoyed learning about our WWII theme this first half-term. We were very lucky to have Mia P's grandmother come in to tell us all about her experiences as an evacuee during the war. Thank you for your support with our 'Make do and Mend' DT projects too. Children have started to create their designs.


